The charity supports children around the world born with cleft lip or cleft palate, ensuring that patients receive all essential surgeries as well as comprehensive cleft care including nutrition, dentistry, orthodontics, speech therapy and psychosocial support.

Children born with cleft conditions often struggle with severe social stigma and isolation, and so if not treated find it difficult to get jobs, make friends and become part of the community in later life. Operation Smile make it their mission to help those with the condition to live a happy, healthy life with a bright future.

The Health and Beauty retailer have been working with the charity for the last three years and have so far donated £33,800, the equivalent of 225 smile surgeries, changing lives forever!
